A huge thank you again to everyone involved with the PTA, whose money allowed us to invest in a revamp of the libraries on each site. This has been very popular with the children and we are excited to be able to offer a greater range of high-quality books to ignite their passion for reading. At Holt Road we invested in some furniture last year to make the library a cosy environment for the children to curl up with a book.
