Collective Worship

Our value this half term is Compassion.

In Open the Book today we heard about Deborah. She was a judge and God's people came to her when they had problems so that she could decide what to do. Many people were complaining about the bad things their enemies, led by Sisera, were doing.

Deborah asked God what to do. The next day Deborah sent for Barak, leader of the Israelite army. She told him to go and collect all the men who could fight and to take them to Mount Tabor. She said that God had told her that he would bring Sisera and his army to the mountain and that there would be a great battle and that the Israelites would win.

Barak didn't think that they could win because Sisera's army was much more powerful than the Israelite army but Deborah told him that they had to do what God had said. Barak didn't think that he could do this on his own so asked Deborah to go with him. She agreed but told him that everyone would know that a woman had won the battle because

Barak had doubted God.

Deborah and Barak led the fighting men to the top of the mountain. She noticed that there were clouds heading towards the mountain. Deborah told Sisera to go into battle. As Barak and his army went towards their enemy, it started to rain extremely heavily. Sisera's chariot got stuck in the mud so Barak ordered his men to attack Sisera's army. They fought and, just as God had promised, Barak and his army won. The enemy ran away.

One of the things we can learn from the story is that we may doubt our ability but our friends can give us the confidence to try things.
