This week we have been lucky enough to have a visit from Mr Zaccias Chaiwalika, (see photo below) one of the teachers from our partner school in Malawi. He has worked across both sites learning about the techniques that we use for teaching and, in return, has shown our children some traditional songs and dances. Some of the older children were taught words and phrases in his local language of Chichewan. On Tuesday, some of our pupils joined children from 10 other schools at the Mili Bwanji Festival where they were immersed in lots of learning about renewable energy, life in Malawi and traditional singing and dancing. We very much hope that this link can continue for many years to come. There are displays at both sites if you would like to come and see them.
