## Collective Worship

Our value this half term is Koinonia (Fellowship) In Open the Book today we heard the next part of the story from the Old Testament about Moses. The Israelites had been allowed to leave Egypt, where they had been slaves. They had crossed the Red Sea and had been walking for a long time. They were fed up and were complaining a lot. They complained about being hungry and thirsty. God told Moses to tap a rock with his special stick. As soon as he did that, water came out of the rock. God also sent quails for the Israelites to eat and sent a type of food called manna, which appeared on the ground each morning. The people didn't know where they were going so God sent a cloud to guide them during the day and a light at night. He led them to the edge of Egypt and they could see the Promised Land ahead.

This story teaches us that sometimes we may be uncomfortable and may even complain about it but often people provide things to help us.
