

NLCF's Emerging Futures Fund – Short Application Window-Deadline June 25, 5pm

This new fund from the National Lottery Community Fund aims to give communities and civil society organisations across the UK 'the space, resource and additional expertise to step back [from COVID-19] and ask questions, imagine alternatives and gather to shape the emerging future'.

There is a total of £1 million for this fund over three to six months. Grants of between £20,000 and £50,000 are available to voluntary, community and social enterprise sector organisations that are based and working within the UK.

The funding is for three different types of work:

- Exploring new narratives, perspectives and community storytelling. The funding is for projects that can create narratives that:
 - Look at the stories emerging from them pandemic, to find out who, or what, needs to be focussed on more.
 - Explore new kinds of relationships that have formed in response to COVID-19.
 - Show what is most important to communities.
 - Help inspire community togetherness after the pandemic.
 - Show where new kinds of infrastructure are being created, and why it's valuable.
- Community foresight and public imagination. The funding is for projects that:
 - Put diverse voices at the centre, and in the lead
 - Activate and strengthen social imagination in communities so that the voices and ideas of local communities can contribute to the renewal of civil society.
 - Support communities to develop and use community foresight practices together
 - Develop approaches with communities to create collective visions and demonstrate practical ways for those visions to be acted upon
 - Know how to use what they've learned from their project to influence change.
- Investing in strong signals of transformation. The funding is for projects that:
 - Can show practical ways about where we go from here
 - Need resource to develop their idea so that when the time is right the idea is more likely to be adopted
 - Can show us why they think the time is right for their idea
 - Can show us how they have responded to different challenges like different patterns of work, community togetherness and the valuing of relationships.

The funding can cover staff salaries, project activities, engagement activities, running costs, and equipment.

The deadline for applications is 25 June 2020 (5pm).





Architecture and the Body is being offered by the Sainsbury Centre for Visual Arts at UEA.



Free online course - COVID-19: Psychological First Aid



Public Health England (PHE) has launched an updated Psychological First Aid (PFA) training module, aimed at all frontline and essential workers and volunteers.

The course teaches the key principles of giving psychological first aid in emergencies and aims to increase awareness and confidence to provide this support to people affected by COVID-19. The course is free, and no previous qualifications are required.

By the end of the course, outcomes will include: understanding how emergencies like the COVID-19 pandemic can affect us, recognising people who may be at increased risk of distress and understanding how to offer practical and emotional support. The course takes around 90 minutes to complete and is also available in three sessions for the learner to complete at their own pace.

Increased threat from Courier Fraud in the west of Norfolk

17 June 2020

In last few weeks Norfolk has seen a **significant spike in courier fraud** in the west of county. Criminals have been targeting vulnerable older people by impersonating police officers. Large sums of money have been stolen.

NSAB is asking everyone to share this information to help protect those at greatest risk from this crime. This threat *could move to other parts of our county*, so we need everyone to share this information.

How is it working? Suspects contact victims by phone, stating they are police officers, saying:

- The victim's personal details have been stolen and the banks are in on it.
 Victims are told to withdraw cash that is suspected as counterfeit. Police will collect and then compensate them later
- The victim's bank cards have been cloned. They tell the victim to go to the bank that is supposedly in on the scam and issuing counterfeit notes. The victim is told to read the serial numbers of the notes out over the phone
- People have been arrested in London using the victim's bank cards and claimed they know the victim
- Other victims were asked how much money they have in their bank and were asked to buy expensive watches and gold bullion.

The common themes are that the suspects use police identities from Paddington Police Station and refer to banks being involved in the distribution of counterfeit notes.

When attending the banks, the victims will often be asked to keep a telephone line open to the fraudster. This is thought to be so the fraudster can monitor the transaction and get an early indication if the scam has been challenged or unsuccessful.

Please take the following actions:

- 1) tell all your work colleagues to be extra vigilant to this scam and pass this information on to family and friends
- 2) share it with service users to help raise awareness
- 3) download this poster and ask local shops and businesses to display it
