Collective Worship

Our value this half term is Reverence (Respect).

In Open the Book today we heard the story about the prophet, Jonah, from the Old Testament.

God told Jonah to go to the city of Nineveh and tell people that they were not doing what God wanted and needed to change their ways and that if they didn't, he would destroy them.

Jonah did not want to go to Nineveh as he had heard how bad the people were and so he decided to sail in the opposite direction. Not long after the boat's journey had started, there was a fierce storm. All the people on the boat were frightened. Jonah realised that God had sent the storm because he had not done what God had asked him to do. Jonah told the passengers to throw him into the sea. As soon as he was in the sea, the storm subsided.

A while later, Jonah was swallowed by a whale. He was inside the whale for a few days before it threw him onto dry land. Jonah went to Nineveh and told the people what to do. They listened to him and so God did not destroy them. Jonah was annoyed that they had changed their ways so that God did not need to destroy them. He was tired and so found a tree and went to sleep underneath it. While he was asleep, God sent a worm to kill the tree. When Jonah woke up, he was upset that the tree had died. God told him that he should not be more upset about this than he was about the people of Nineveh changing their ways as God was very pleased that the people of Nineveh were now doing what he wanted them to do.

One of the things we can learn from the story is that while we may not always want to do something we have been told to do, it is usually the right thing and we should listen to what people tell us.
