Luke Temple author visit

Collective Worship

Our value this half term is Compassion.

In Open the Book today we heard the story of Jesus' arrest. Judas, one of his disciples, secretly told people to arrest Jesus. When they came to arrest him, Judas showed them who Jesus was. They arrested Jesus. When he had been arrested, most of his disciples ran away although Peter stayed with him. He tried to attack the people who were arresting Jesus but Jesus told him not to. He said that God wants him to die for all people. The people who arrested Jesus then took him to the religious leaders.
