News this week:

Year 3/4 Castle Museum visit

Last Friday the children in Year 3 and 4 spent the day at Norwich Castle Museum. When we arrived, we were introduced to two Iceni people and two Romans. The Iceni did not like the Romans because the Romans were stealing their property. The Romans had defeated Boudica. After our introduction we worked at four activities. One was looking at Roman artefacts where there were parts of roof tiles, pottery and other items archaeologists had dug up. The next activity was learning about Iceni life. The children learnt about some of the jobs that people would have done at the time the Romans invaded. After packed lunch there were two more activities - learning about life as a Roman soldier. As part of this the children had a small shield each and had to be arranged in different formations, just as Roman soldiers would have done to avoid being attacked. The final activity was making a torc. This was an item of jewellery which the children were able to take away with them. The day ended back all together where we had a vote on whether we thought the Iceni were right to complain about the Romans taking their property or whether the Romans were right to take the property and use the money to make improvements. Well over half of the children were on the side of the Iceni. The children worked well during the day and learnt a great deal about the time in Britain when the Romans invaded.
