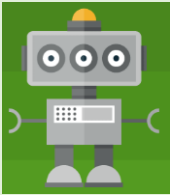

Topic:

In topic this week, we have been asked to take part in an Art competition called "Draw A Robot", children in Key Stage 1 (aged 5 - 7 years old) have the chance to draw a robot that they'd like to see in the future. The robot could be designed to accomplish any task or job - the sky's the limit!



Draw a Robot Competition

English:

Continuing with the "Draw A Robot" competition you can add up to a 200-word description and five key features (labelled on the drawing of the robot).

Year 1

Around your robot picture write some exciting adjectives about the robot. Remember adjectives are used to describe!

Year 2

Have a go at using expanded noun phrases, for example: 'The strong and hard robot has 6 long and stretchy arms', when writing your description of the robot.

Maths:

Year 1: Have a go at measuring liquid into containers. Try to compare the liquid and identify an empty, $\frac{1}{4}$ full, $\frac{1}{2}$ full and full container.

Year 2: Try and measure out liquid in ml. Then try and have a go at using the greater than and less than symbols to compare the amount of liquid.
