We will be learning the 'sounds' made by the letters g, o, c & k.


We are learning to read 'I', 'the', 'is', 'as', ʻa', 'no', 'qo' and 'of'.

We will be exploring sorting, organising objects into sets based on their colour, size, shape etc.



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


