This week in phonics...

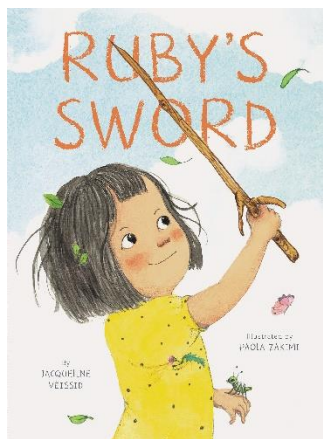
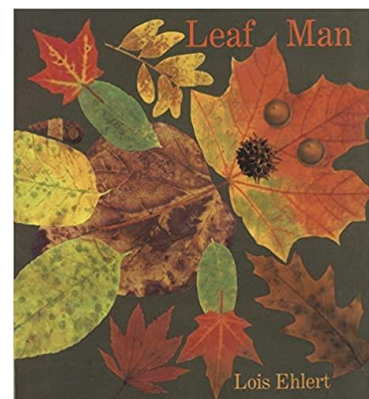
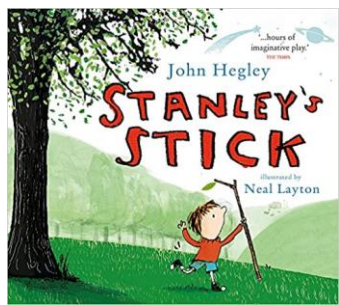
We will be learning to read and write words, consolidating our knowledge of the digraphs/trigraphs ai, ee, igh, oo. We are learning to read 'Mr' and 'Mrs', as well as learning how to spell 'as', 'a' and 'no'.

Why this 'theme'?

We have chosen this theme as it is World Book Day on Thursday 3rd March and we are dedicating a whole week to the promoting of books. The children love using sticks in their imaginative play, pretending they are something else.

This week in maths...

We will be exploring time, including learning the days of the week and using the language 'today', 'tomorrow', 'yesterday', 'after', 'before', 'now', 'later', 'soon', 'then', 'next'.

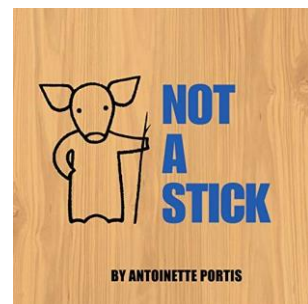


Did you know...
