Balance B/F £1900	Contribution to new Federation minibus purchased 19.11.20 (total cost £19,300)	Competitions and festivals will restart as soon as government guidelines permit. Having transport enables more pupils to access more events. An employed driver enables a greater number of staff, not qualified to drive, to accompany children to fixtures and sporting events thus raising the whole school profile of physical education.
£1 000	Pupils will continue to compete in SSP arranged competition; local leagues and, increasingly, in Nebula competitions and festivals as the partnership with the Community Sports Foundation develops and a new local venue becomes available.  Costs are related to subscriptions; transport; purchase of Nebula trophies; supply costs covering attending staff; hiring of venue and provision of referees/coaches.
