

What Does Interference Iggy Do?

Inference Iggy helps to make **inferences** from the text.

This means that he is there to help you to **hunt for clues** in the text.

These clues might help you to work out how someone is feeling, why somebody did something or why something is happening.

The two types of question that Inference Iggy likes to ask most are: 'why?' and 'how do you know?'

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What Might Inference Iggy Ask?


Inference Iggy might ask questions like these:
