English

Read daily with your child and record this in their reading record.

Please encourage your child to practise weekly spellings. This can be completed in their spelling books.

It is expected in Key Stage One that children can form all letters accurately. Please encourage your child to practise handwriting using the letter formation sheet.

Maths

In KS1 we follow the White Rose Maths (WRM) scheme in our maths lesson. WRM have produced a handy app that enables you to access games linked to the topics we have been learning about. Please use the link below if you wish to download the app - it's free!!

Year 1 - The children will be learning about multiplication and division. Practise skip counting forward and backwards in 2,5 and 10's. Use your knowledge of multiplication and division to group and share objects from around the house (pasta, sweets, shells, stones).

Year 2 - The children will be learning to tell the time on an analogue clock. Practise telling the time to the o'clock, quarter past, half past and quarter to. For an extra challenge try to every five minutes. The children will also be learning to measure mass in grams and kilograms. Have some fun in the kitchen consolidation this knowledge by baking a tasty snack.

Further subjects

In KS1 we explore a range of subjects including science, history, geography, computing, music, PSHE/RSE, PE, Art/DT and RE. Below you will find a selection of home learning challenges linked to the learning we are doing in school.

Science - Last half term we learned about planting and growing in science. As we head into warmer weather get involved in your own planting and growing. Plant in the garden or observe how plants or trees change over the next half term. Can you write a set of instructions to help somebody plant and take care of a flower?

History - The children will be learning about the royal family this half term. A real opportunity given the upcoming coronation. You could research the royal family and create a fact file about them. Design and create your own bunting, crown or flag in preparation for the event. Watch the coronation in May.

Art & Design - The children will be sculpting their own dragons this half term. Research different illustrations of dragons and sketch or paint your own. This art unit is inspired by the prominence of dragons around Norwich. Can you spot any next time that you are in the city?
