English:

Year 1 - We will continue to be story writers. We will plan our stories and then begin to write them. The children will be learning how to use capital letters and punctuation.

Year 2 - We will be continuing to explore descriptive writing. We will be using our senses and expanded noun phrases to add extra detail to our writing.

Maths

Year 1 - We will be exploring how to use a number line to solve subtraction number sentences.

Year 2 - We will be starting to look at measure, focussing on 'cm'. We will be learning how to measure accurately and compare the length of different objects.
