

Hook: The Seaside

We will become members of a seaside planning committee, who wish to build a community centre to hold a historical seaside exhibit. What challenges will the planning committee face? Will building the exhibit be as straight forward as we hoped?

<u>English</u>

In Year 1 we will be exploring seaside poetry. We will be identifying different features of poetry, and practice writing our own rhyming lines of poetry.

In Year 2 we will be writing a character description about a trapped octopus. We will then be writing a series of instructions on how to free the octopus using detailed instructional language.

<u>Maths</u>

In Year 1 we will be sequencing a series of events in chronological order. We will be using key vocabulary including before, after, next, and time related vocabulary to help us with our learning. In Year 2 will be solving place value problems. We will be using our reasoning skills to helps us solve these problems.

Theme

We will kick start our theme by exploring photographs, objects and pictures that illustrate how seaside villages may have changed over time. We will compare with present day seaside towns, spotting similarities and differences between then and now.

In PSHE we will be creating a 'working agreement'. The children will work collaboratively to decide what they would like their RSE lessons to look like. We will be creating posters and visual displays that will be up in all KS1 classrooms to act as a reminder of the rules we wrote together and agreed with also.

Half Term Home Learning Challenge

As part of our seaside topic, we would like you to create your very own seaside scenes. You can be as creative as you like; maybe you like painting, arts and crafts or creating models. Use your talents and interests to create the scene. We will be sending home small pieces of paper for you to write a short description of your seaside scene.

Each child will need to bring in a cardboard box (roughly the size of a shoe box) that they will use to create their talking boxes.
