A big thank you to Lorin Lafave for visiting both our parents and children in Y3-6 this week. Her presentations have helped to inform both adults and children alike, in how to keep safe online. We will be following up some of the messages she gave us throughout the year to ensure the children are empowered to make the right decisions about their own online activity.

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#### Dogs' Trust

Jo from Dog's Trust visited R-2 classrooms this week with her toy dog, Patch, to teach us all about how to stay safe around dogs - friendly dogs, energetic dogs, curious dogs and dogs that want to be left alone. The most important thing to remember is to check that it's ok to pet an unfamiliar dog ...and to turn away, stand still and cross your arms if a dog bothers you and you don't like it. We also had fun practising rolling up like a hedgehog, to keep ourselves safe if an energetic dog knocks us over! Year 3 and 4 enjoyed their visit from The Dog's Trust while having the opportunity to apply their mathematical skills to discover how much it costs to keep a dog for a year. The children discovered what a dog requires to keep healthy and learnt about the reasons dogs need regular vet checks. They were also told about the important role of a microchip and the fact it is now a legal requirement when we take on the responsibility of having a dog as a pet. During the KS2 assembly the children were all told about the safe way to approach a dog and it was explained what they should do if a dog chases them. The children all learnt a lot about dogs and had a great time putting their maths skills in to practise.
