# Just a note.....

## Mill Lane/Holt Road junction road crossing patrol

Please be aware that there will be no road crossing patrol at the start and end of the day on **Monday 20**<sup>th</sup> **February**. The children will need to take extra care when crossing the road and we would advise that particularly young children might need to be accompanied by an adult during those times if they are needing to cross the road. Unfortunately the school is not able to provide another member of staff to do this duty as they will not be covered by insurance.

#### **Attendance**

Please can we remind everyone that both school sites start at **8.55am**. All children need to be in their classrooms ready for registration by this time. Any children arriving after this time will be marked as late which will affect their overall attendance. When children are late it can make things difficult for everyone. The teacher has to stop and wait for the child to settle down and the rest of the class is disrupted. The child misses the first part of the day or lesson and may feel embarrassed or awkward. If a child is late 15 mins every day, that is the equivalent of 95% attendance. We welcome your support with ensuring all of our children arrive at school on time. Thank you for your support with this.
