What's happened in our school this week?

Even if your child is not in Year 6, I am sure you will have been aware through social media and TV news bulletins, that children aged 10-11 years old, across the country, have been sitting their Standardised Assessment Tests (SATs) this week. Obviously children are assessed (through class discussions and marking work as well as formal testing) all the time throughout their school life to allow teachers to plan lessons that will help the children move on with their learning. The Year 6 SATs can be more stressful for children to take than other tests that they complete during their primary school life however, because they are externally marked (in other words, sent away to someone who does not know the children), have to be taken on a set day across the country and have very rigorous guidelines for how they are administered.

We have been extremely proud of our Year 6 children this week as they have approached each test with maturity and enthusiasm. Today they have been rewarded with a day of light activities followed by a "party"! Well done Year 6 - now you can concentrate on your final few weeks of your time here at Horsford Primary and the rehearsals of A Midsummer Night's Dream. We are looking forward to watching you on July 14th.

We are very fortunate to have been offered the chance to take part in a vocal project based at Norwich Cathedral and organised by Norwich School. On Tuesday the head of vocal studies at Norwich School came to our Mill Lane Site, along with two 'A' Level music students and three choristers from Norwich Cathedral Choir. They taught a group of about twenty of our pupils three songs. Over the next few weeks we will practise the songs before the Norwich School people come back after half term. A few days later we will take part in a concert in Norwich Cathedral along with two other local schools. It promises to be a very exciting and memorable event.
