Our theme for Collective Worship this half term has been Justice. Reverend Margaret has visited us throughout this term to introduce the value to the children through assemblies on both sites. We have continued to explore Justice throughout the rest of the term during our Collective Worship sessions.

#### **Open the Book**

In Open the Book today the children heard the story of how God told Gideon to defeat the Midianites. This comes from the book of Judges in the Old Testament. Gideon was afraid to do what he had been told but he trusted God. Gideon gathered together the Israelites but God told him that there were too many people and that anyone who was frightened of fighting should be sent away.

God then told Gideon to make all the Israelites drink from the river. Three hundred people lapped like a dog and God told Gideon to use those people to fight the

Midianites. There were many more Midianites than Israelites but the noise of the trumpets of the Israelites and shouting made the Midianites think that there were far more people and so they turned and left, leaving the Israelites as the victors. The story teaches us that we may be afraid or frightened of some things but if we trust people, they can help us overcome our fears.
