Our new theme for Collective Worship this half term is Justice. Reverend Margaret visited us last Wednesday to introduce the value to the children through an assembly on both sites. We will be exploring Justice throughout the rest of the term during our Collective Worship.

Open the Book

In today's Open the Book collective worship the children heard the story of brothers Jacob and Esau, who were the sons of Isaac and Rebekah and the first twins mentioned in the Bible. The twins grew up very different. Jacob was "a quiet man, staying among the tents" and his mother's favourite. Esau was "a skillful hunter, a man of the open country" and his father's favourite.

When the time came for Isaac to give his blessing to his sons, Jacob and his mother got together to deceive Isaac into blessing Jacob in Esau's place. When Esau found that his blessing had been given to Jacob, he threatened to kill his brother, and Jacob fled. Next week we will find out what happened to Jacob after this.
