# **Horsford C of E VA Primary School**

#### What's happened in our school this week?

This week has been one of our busiest this year, full of exciting learning opportunities for the children and a chance to come together as a school and celebrate Easter with our fayre this afternoon. As we write this we are still busy organising the stalls and making sure everything is ready on time, so we hope it was enjoyable for everyone involved. As usual we must say a huge thank you to the PTA members for arranging such a wonderful event and for those parents who have given donations generously - all money received from the fayre is used to fund school visits and resources across both sites.

Our Nebula reading week was based on Mythical Creatures this term, with each year group using a chosen text to help immerse them in the theme. Years R-2 read The Paperbag Princess, Years 3/4, How to train your dragon and Years 5/6, Fantastic beasts and where to find them. It was lovely to see so many parents attend the reading events on Tuesday and Wednesday morning: we hope you enjoyed the time spent learning with your child if you were able to come. To accompany the event we have emailed out a reading guide for parents with this newsletter. We hope you find it useful.

To help the children engage even more with the theme we also arranged for a storyteller to visit Year R-1, while Years 2-4 will be visiting Bewilderwood next Monday and Years 5/6 explored Harry Potter World on Thursday. All of these opportunities really help to bring the topic to life and have a real impact on children's ideas as they are able to bring elements of the books and visits into their writing. Thank you for your contributions towards these activities as without them we would not be able to provide such valuable learning experiences for the children.

The Key Stage 2 singing club rehearses each week and, since the beginning of term, has been learning some songs ready to sing at a concert. The concert took place on Wednesday evening at Epic Studios in Norwich. As well as children from our school, there were singers from the other Nebula Partnership schools and from Drayton Junior School. There was a rehearsal for all schools on Wednesday morning - only the second time that the schools had met together to practise the songs. In the evening, the children met together just before the concert to warm up and to be reminded of what they had learnt earlier in the day. All the children sang exceptionally well and the Horsford children were a real credit to themselves, with many very positive comments being made by members of the audience. The singing was not the only part of the concert. There was a funk group and a brass group from City of Norwich School, both of which gave very inspiring performances. The evening was a great success and one which the children will remember for a very long time. Thank you to Mr Patient and Mrs Westlake for their time and commitment to this project.

On Thursday local entertainer and magician Ollie Day came to Mill Lane to lead a session about road safety. It was a fun hour and many of the children were invited to take part. They were reminded how to cross roads safely and how vital it is that they always wear a cycle helmet when they are out on their bikes. Ollie Day's humour really helped him to get the message across to the children and hopefully they will now be even safer when they are out on the road.
