What's happened in our school this week?

This week's news is a recount written by two of our Year 6 pupils sharing their visit to The Space in Sprowston. Thank you to Joey Halls and Amia Harper for letting us know all about their day.

On Monday 16th of May, Year 6 took part in a Crucial Crew event organised by Norfolk County Council to inform children about staying safe. We had a great time and learnt many safety skills; these skills included street, fire, gas and water safety. We also learnt how to put people in the recovery position, how to be safe around electricity, how cigarettes can harm you very badly and what information you should and shouldn't give to strangers or people online.

This trip was shared with two other schools: Buxton Primary and Taverham Hall Prep School. It was interesting to see the different attitudes to learning we saw from all the different learners.

We were sorted into groups with the other schools. There were 9 groups in all with each group starting on a certain activity and having 11 minutes to complete it. After that first 11 minutes we all moved on to another station.

Our favourite was the fire simulation. We had to identify all the fire hazards in a generic child's bedroom. After that the room went dark, we were told it was night time. We heard a smoke alarm and fake smoke filled the room. We were to get low because smoke rises. We had to wait for the sirens and once we heard them a "firewoman" came in and told to leave via a door to our left. Then it was over and we were back into the fresh, non-smoky air.

So to conclude, Year 6 had a great time and learnt a lot more about how to stay safe in different situations.
