NSPCC Visit

Hayley, from the NSPCC, visited us on Thursday to deliver an assembly on both sites explaining how children can access help if they have anything they are worried about. She asked the children who they might talk to if they had a problem and we discussed who a "trusted adult" might be. The children said they would talk to their parents, grandparents, teachers or other adults at school. Hayley then told them about Childline, the national phone line that is run by the NSPCC, which children can access 24 hrs a day, 7 days a week. The children were told they can phone this number for free from any phone and talk to a trusted adult, if they didn't feel they had one to talk to in person. The children were given a way to help remember the Childline phone number 08001111, by using actions with their hands. See if the children can teach you the actions! As this is such an important charity we have agreed to help raise money for the NSPCC through a sponsored event. Please see the letter given out today which explains what we are going to do on each site. The children have also been given their sponsor forms to bring home. The class with the most sponsor forms sent back to school will be awarded a certificate for best class participation.
