The paramedics talked about how they help people and what to do in an emergency. The excitement of the sirens and flash lights will certainly be a talking point for many days to come.

In Year 2 the children have been learning about the importance of exercise. hygiene and healthy eating. They even had fun making fruit kebabs and trying some new, exotic fruits.

The children in year 5 have been working scientifically this week during their lessons on the human body. They wanted to find out if their height affected how fast they could run, throw, jump and kick. The children enjoyed setting up experiments on the playground and measuring using metre sticks, rulers and trundle wheels. Next week, they will be putting their results into a line graph and evaluating the data collected.

Year 6 had their first lesson on the recorders this week! Lots of squeaking was heard coming from the year 6 rooms until they got the hang of gentle breathing, but by the end of the lesson it was already sounding great! Miss Blyth's maths group have been making the most of the beautiful spring weather with a maths lesson outside. They took their pulse rates before exercising on the running track then monitoring how long it took for their bpm to return to normal. The results were then transferred to line graphs. The weather is not looking very good for this weekend unfortunately so we hope you managed to have a good time, whatever you have planned!
