Then, we went outside to look around the houses. There were lots of different types of houses because there were different theories about how they lived. After we had a good look around, we all went into the great hall and somebody talked about all the things we had seen in the houses and answered any questions we had. Then we had our lunch in a room near the reception and headed off to the museum. 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


THE NEBULA PARTNERSHIP HORSFORD CE PRIMARY SCHOOL HOMEWORK SURVEY RESULTS



83% of parents would like their child to have homework set.

For those who said they would not like to have homework they elaborated with comments like; 'I feel that at primary age a school day should provide enough academic work and after school and weekends are for play, rest, family activities, hobbies, important social time etc.'



Which subjects do you think children should be given homework in?

Maths	58%
Reading	74%
Writing	53%
Discussion	5%
Spellings	68%
Class set homework related to the lessons	53%
Whole school homework with one common theme	16%

Some parents commented further;

'The homework is very rarely related to the lessons in individual classes and is never differentiated within her year group. My child also does not appear to be given any praise for the effort she puts in.'

'SEN children shouldn't be set the same homework as more able children. If they have to, then it should be made so SEN children understand the work.'

'I do think they should get maths and English homework nightly.'

'Too many posters and drawings is not helpful - worksheets, and actual work is better!'

'It doesn't really seem to be supporting my children to be doing similar as each other as they are too different to work together and seem more suitable to the older one. I want to be able to support the range of learning not just drawing a picture. Why can't it be linked to what they are doing in class?'

'Homework that is set needs to be relative to their learning NOT random topics that inevitably the parents have to find the information on using the internet (ex: the queen and the things that have happened during her reign). The children need to have a homework that will aid their core learning skills such as maths and English.'

'Personally I find the best time to do homework is weekends as my child has activities most evenings but does find time to fit in reading and spellings during the week. Maths homework using the computer worked well, perhaps this could be implemented again.'

'I would like more specific maths homework rather than the online games and guidance on the best way to support times tables at home, thank you.'

'Homework should be for the child.'
