Collective Worship

Our value this half term is Koinonia (Fellowship)

In Open the Book today we heard a story showing Moses as leader.

In the story, we learnt how the Israelites had been treated as slaves by the Egyptians. Eventually the Egyptians let the Israelites go free so they set off. The Egyptians changed their minds and started to chase after the Israelites. The Israelites were by the Red Sea wondering what to do. God told Moses to hold out his special stick over the sea and that this would make the sea divide and provide dry ground for the Israelites to cross. Moses did as he was told and the sea divided into two. There were two walls of water on each side. The Israelites crossed through the gap between the two walls of water. When they had crossed it, God told Moses to put his staff back over the sea. The sea returned to its usual level and covered the Egyptians and all that were with them.

One of the things we can learn from the story is that there are people who we can trust and, if we do what they say, we will be safe.
