We will be learning to read and write words containing compound words (e.g. moonlit, raincoat, starfish).

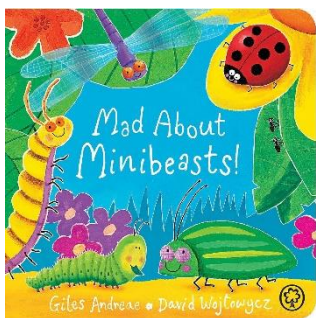
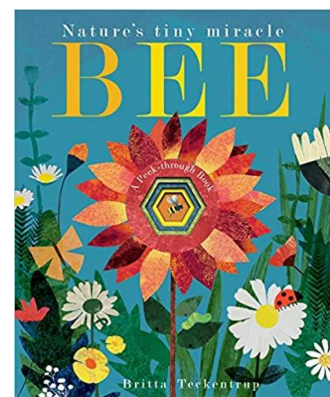
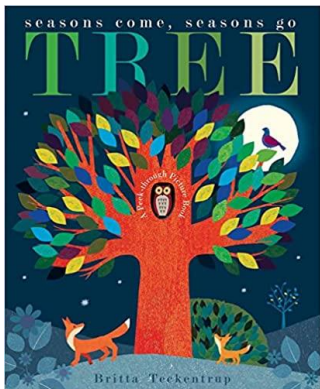
We are learning to read 'they', 'said' and 'have', as well as learning how to spell 'he', 'we' and 'be'.

Homework: Make observational pictures of signs of spring time (e.g. plants/ flowers growing, lambs and chicks)
