









Easter Eggs

Easter eggs are traditionally painted chicken eggs. This practice of painting eggs is thought to have originated in Mesopotamia, where eggs were stained red in memory of the blood of Jesus. Eggs also symbolise the empty tomb, from which Jesus emerged when he came back to life., or new life. Easter eggs today are often made of chocolate. Many countries still have finely painted eggs like these in Austria.









Easter Flowers

Lilies have white blossoms, which represent the purity of Jesus. Lilies, daffodils and tulips all push through the earth in the spring, showing new life, and are often used in flower arrangements in churches around Easter.
