Excellent Academic Standards

Taverham students consistently achieve high standards of progress both at GCSE and A level.

The positive culture and celebrations of success are a very important and high profile element of our school. Award evenings and celebration assemblies congratulate students' efforts and application in all areas of school life, be it in the classroom, on the sports field, in drama, music, in leadership, or community service. The staff team at Taverham, also understand that the smaller acknowledgements of successes whether it be through feedback, the recognition of progress or thanks, is vital in building student confidence, self-esteem and a love of learning.

We have an excellent track record of students gaining places at their chosen University or future pathways, underpinned by a wealth of educational trips, links with Universities and a comprehensive programme of guidance. For the last few years our students have been offered places to read at Oxford and Cambridge. In 2020 66% of our students secured a place at either a Russell Group institution or at one of the top third universities. 20% of Year 13 were recognised and awarded as Norfolk Scholars 2019 for their exceptional performance at A-Level. Other students have secured employment and Higher Level Apprenticeships with prestige companies including Grant Thornton and Bentley Motors.

We believe it is essential that learning extends beyond the classroom.

Taverham High School wants our students to take a lead role in the school community and to be seen as role models to other students and within the wider community. The sense of community is epitomised by RAGFEST; an annual fundraising week led by Sixth Form students. Each year students select a charitable cause and plan a programme of activities to raise money for that cause. Since starting RAGFEST we have raised in total over £25,000 for charitable causes.

What lies beyond Taverham High School and Sixth Form is really important to us. We want our students to be equipped both academically but also with leadership skills.

For the past two years we were pleased to have been asked to participate in the Norfolk Crew Future Leaders Initiative led by Nelson's Spirit. This offers students the chance to develop their leadership skills through collaborating with other aspiring leaders across Norfolk along with a range of Adult Leaders from Business, Charities and Schools. The students can benefit from meetings and master classes led by CEOs of businesses, charities and Headteachers which will help them develop the skills necessary to become Future Leaders.

Due to increasing demand from other areas, we provide transport to bring students from the Queen's Hills area of Costessey and Longwater Lane. This is subject to a small charge.
