We will be off on our travels, exploring the continents, countries and oceans of the world. We will be learning about different cultures and traditions.

English:

We will be exploring poetry focusing particularly on the poem, 'The Owl and the Pussycat'. We will be looking at rhyme within poetry and having a go at creating our own rhyming poems.

In maths we will be revisiting fractions. This will include fractions of shapes, numbers and measures. We will be exploring this practically and through word problems.
