Theme: Ahoy there me hearties! We are going to set sail on the seven seas. We have discovered a ship wreck and a message in a bottle from Pirate Pete. He needs to recruit some more pirates to help him solve a pirate puzzle.

English:

In English we will be exploring different genres including letters, diaries, personal recounts and stories.

Theme:

In DT we will be designing, making and evaluating the effectiveness of a pirate shelter.

Can you help? Do you have any materials suitable for making a pirate shelter e.g. old sheets, large pieces of material like tarpaulin, plastic and cardboard boxes.
