You will need to include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A title (possibly with bubble writing) • An introduction • Subheadings • Lots of facts • Pictures • Lots of colour • Anything else you wish to include <p style="text-align: center;">Extra Challenge:</p> <p>Add a glossary that explains the meaning of tricky words throughout your information page.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Writing</p> <p style="text-align: center;"> </p> <p>Create your own story about a character that is nurse by day and superhero by night (or in their spare time).</p> <p>Begin by creating your superhero character – giving them a name, drawing a picture of them, outlining their superpowers and anything else you want to add.</p> <p>Then create a story involving your character. Make sure it has a build-up, at least one problem and a resolution.
