The focus is fractions. The focus is Area and Perimeter. Work through a lesson a day.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Extra Challenge:</p> <p>In 1971 our money system changed to that which we use today. (Decimalisation)</p> <p>Research what coins and notes would have been in circulation during WW2. Can you work out how many pennies would have been in a pound on VE day? Write some more 'old money' based questions to share with your parents or grandparents.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Reading</p>  <p>Read a book of your choice for at least 15 minutes each day.</p> <p>Please aim to complete at least 30 minutes of readtheory.org tasks each day</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">Topic: VE Day</p> <p><i>This Friday (8th May) celebrates the 75th anniversary of VE Day.</i></p> <p>Create an information poster about what happened in Horsford, or Norwich, on VE Day. You could include a walk to the war memorial in Horsford to research the soldiers who died in the war so you can celebrate their role in defeating the German army.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Extra Challenge:</p> <p>Use the information you have collected for the poster to help you produce a radio broadcast about VE day.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Writing</p> <p>Imagine you are a soldier on the frontline during World War 2. You have just found out that the war in Europe is over.</p> <p>Write a diary entry about your experience. Remember to include the date, how you are feeling, where you are when you were told the news, what your plans are to celebrate.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Year 3:</p> <p>You need to include adjectives and adverbs in your writing.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Year 4:</p> <p>As well as adjectives and adverbs, you need to begin to write more complex sentences by including conjunctions. Also try to include paragraphs in your writing.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Extra Challenge:</p> <p>Watch either Valiant, The Railway Children or Five Children and It, then write a review of the film. Remember you can review the film even if you didn't enjoy it.
