We will be developing our skills in representing, comparing and composition of numbers 1, 2 and 3.

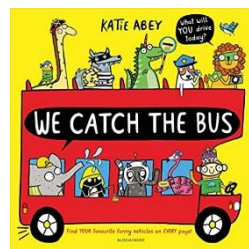
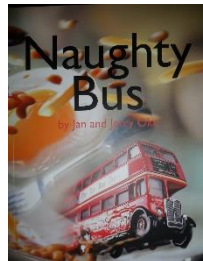
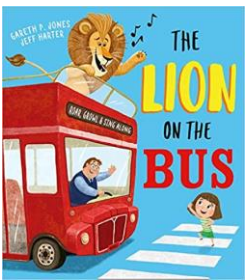
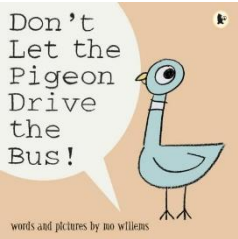
Why this 'theme'?
