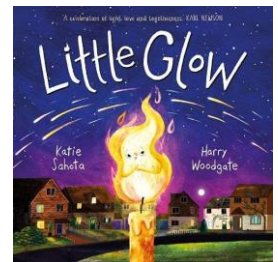
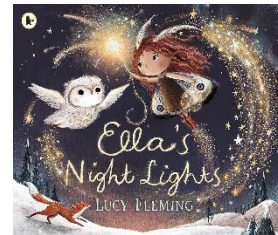
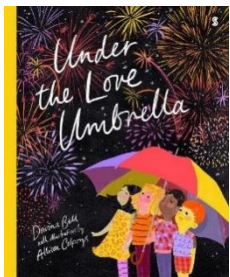


Did you know...
