We will find out about different beliefs, sharing similarities and differences with our own.

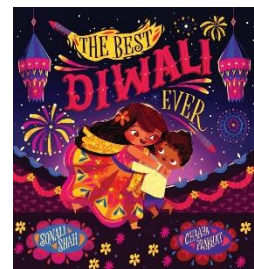
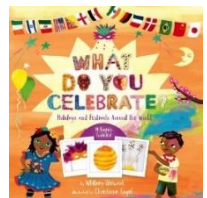
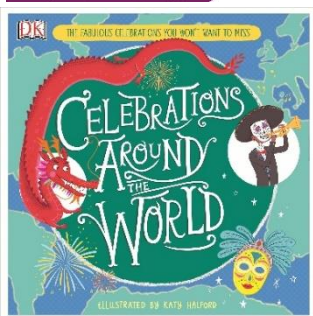
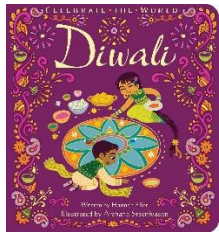
Skills Focus
