Doreen Kelf



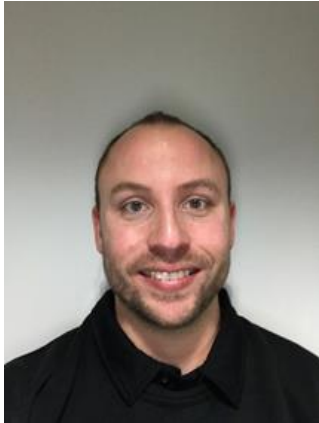
