John Hindley

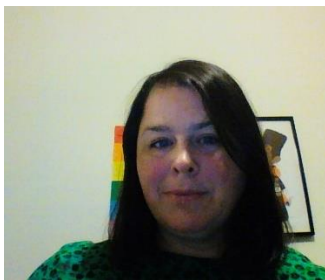
