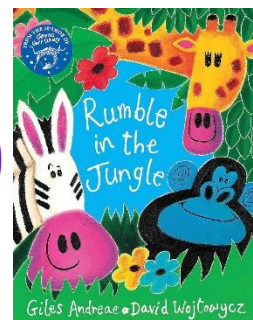
## Did you know...
