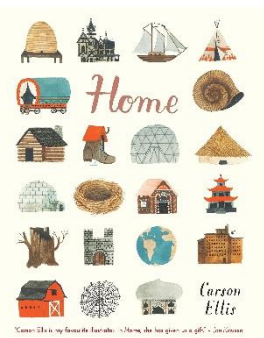

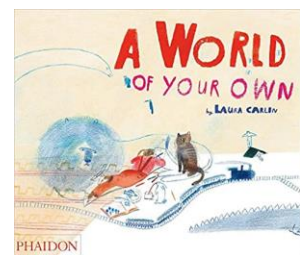
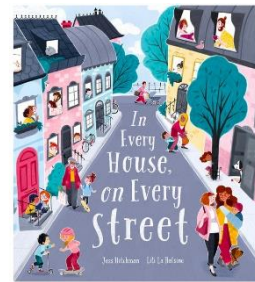
Did you know...
