This week in phonics...

We will be learning to read and write words containing the sounds 'ear', 'air' and 'ure'.

We are learning to read 'were' and 'pushes', as well as continuing to practise all previously taught words.

This week in maths...

We will be learning to combine two groups of objects to find the total.

Why this 'theme'?

We are exploring this theme as the children have been interested in 'goodies' and 'baddies' during our monster theme and this leads nicely onto exploring this further.

Skills Focus

Expressive Arts & Design: Learning new words to a familiar tune.

Computing: Planning and giving instructions of how to get to Grandma's house

PSED: Sharing the boy who cried wolf and discussing, talking about the things we like that might be the same/different than our friends.

Communication and language: Sharing ideas about the picture.

Vocabulary

Expressive Arts & Design: sing, song, perform.

Computing: Instructions, plan, technology, test.

PSED: Similar, different, same, responsibility, consequence.

Communication and language: why because.

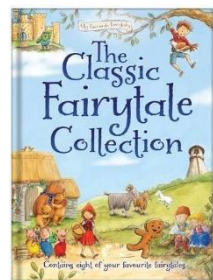
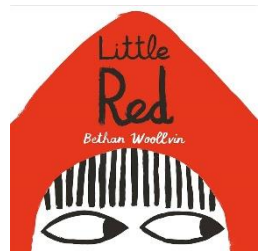
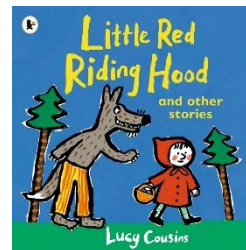
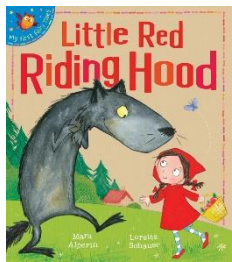
