This week in phonics...

We will be learning to read and write consonant blends at the beginning and end of words (e.g. frost, crust, stamp) as well as including some digraphs (e.g. crunch, shrink).

We are learning to read the tricky word 'ask', as well as learning how to spell 'was', 'you' and 'my'.

This week in maths...

We will be building numbers to 20, exploring the counting patterns beyond ten.

We have chosen this theme as the children have been particularly interested in the minibeasts in our outside area and we have a special visit from the 'Mini Monsters Creepy Crawly Roadshow'.

PSED: private

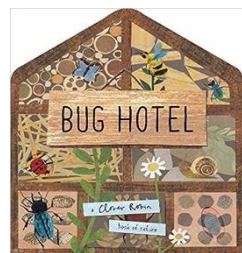
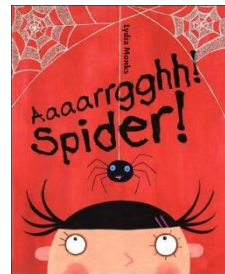
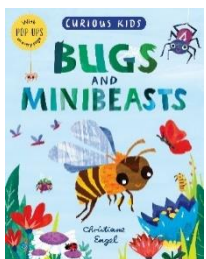
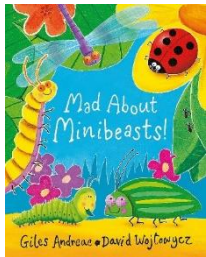


Did you know...
